Over the last few months, the Haemophilia Foundation Western Australia (HFWA) Management Committee has been reviewing the services we offer to the community.

Currently we provide -

- Education to individuals, families and the wider community around the causes and impacts of bleeding disorders. This is done in person, by telephone, during community presentations or through the provision of written information and resources

- Peer support for individuals and families living with the impact of a bleeding disorder

- Advocacy to encourage the clear understanding of the specific needs of women with bleeding disorders, people with von Willebrand disease, and the lesser-known and understood range of very rare bleeding disorders

- Community fundraising events, regular breakfast events and camps that offer enjoyment and connection with other families and individuals, and allow connection and conversations, without the need to explain the challenges that we live with

- Advocacy, in conjunction with Haemophilia Foundation Australia. For new treatment products to be made available to individuals

The HFWA, in conjunction with the Haemophilia Foundation Australia, has been a strong and unrelenting voice for change in treatment and services over many years.

Over the past few years, the number of people attending our activities (other than a small core) has been getting smaller and there is less response to requests to become involved in the foundation. As a committee who are keen to make a difference, we are questioning whether we continue operating.

If you want this strong representation to continue, you need to tell us and more importantly, become involved. Yes, we know people are busy and guess what - so are we, the committee members. The choice is now yours; let us know.

The HFWA works hard to lobby for new and emerging treatments to be made available to the bleeding disorders community. This has resulted in huge changes in the opportunities for people with bleeding disorders to lead a productive, fulfilling and more pain-free lifestyle. This is very different from treatment that was available as little as ten years ago.

How HFWA can be of value to you and your family?


How will you become involved with your foundation?
